

Dog Walking Map Colour Key:

BLUE: Dogs on lead. Vicars Wood, Bishops Palace Field, Burial Ground, The Swathe, Mulsanne Park.

ORANGE: Dogs permitted off-lead but under control. Bill Bailey's.

GREEN: Public Footpaths and Bridleways. You do not have to put your dog on a lead on public paths, as long as it is under close control. However, as a general rule, keep your dog on a lead if you cannot rely on its obedience.

RED DOTS: Dog Bins. Various locations.

Purple: Police Field, (private property). See notice. Please note that whilst visiting the Police HQ, on business, you are welcome to use their car park. However, this privilege is not extended to visiting the site purely to walk your dog(s). Should you do so, you may be approached by Officers and asked to move. Please respect this simple rule and help retain Nettleham's reputation as a good neighbour.



Not Identified: Pavements abutting Highways. You do not have to put your dog on a lead on public paths, as long as it is under close control. But as a general rule, keep your dog on a lead if you cannot rely on its obedience.

Farmers' Fields: these are private property and you should seek the landowner's permission to walk on them before doing so. Failure to obtain this permission is trespass. There may be a danger to your dog from herbicides etc that have been sprayed on the ground. If there is a public footpath across a field, you should stick strictly to it. Think very carefully about entering fields containing livestock; cattle or sheep. Further advice is contained within The Countryside Code which is well worth reading and copies are available, online, in various formats.
